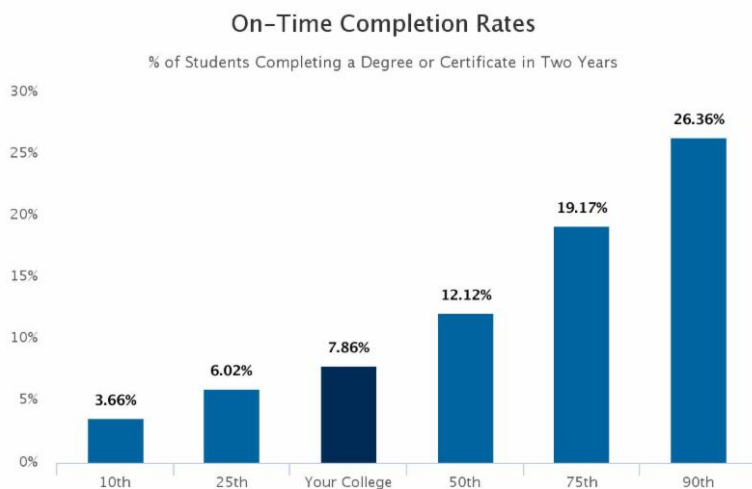


First-time, Full-time, On-time Graduation Rates



Community colleges are also known as two-year institutions. But how many of your students actually complete in two years? In 2015 the NCCBP added a new "on-time" measure for completion rates and transfer rates.



These charts shows results for the Fall 2012 cohort of first-time, full-time students. NCCBP collects this data before it has been sent to IPEDS.

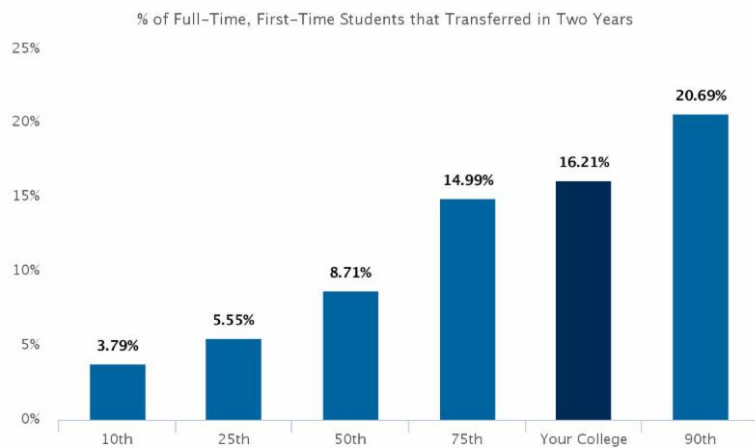
